The Bailiff: Ozouf, we have decided to grant the conclusions of the Attorney General mainly because of your age, you will therefore be sentenced to three years probation on Counts 1 to 3 and probation for one year concurrent on Counts 24 to 26 and you will serve a total of 120 hours Community Service.

As regards the other two, Mr. Attorney and Mr. Benest, we are going to ask for an adjournment 'sine die' and you will come back when you want a date, to enable an assessment to be made of Le Cocq's suitability to enter the hostel, and that will include his having to go there for a period of assessment. Are you prepared to co-operate Le Cocq? Very well, that does not mean to say that we will accept the recommendations when they come, we will leave our options open, we must I think. In the meantime you are both remanded in custody. And we should say this, that Tregaskis, we want to make it clear we think that you should be dealt with on the same level as Le Cocq, and therefore if he goes to prison we think there is no reason to distinguish between the two of you, you will go to prison. If it's possible to keep him out of prison because of the report, and we consider it proper, then you may take it that you will not go to prison.
