Her Majesty's Attorney General -v- M. CalterBreach of probation order.

Deputy Bailiff:You have let the Court down because the Court put you on trust, and you have let yourself down as well. We have very seriously considered punishing you for the original offences. We have read Dr. Fogarty's report, and he says that you are touchy, impulsive and hot tempered, and he doubts the extent of your motivation, and so in those circumstances it is only your Probation officer who has saved you from prison, and if you come back before us for any further breach you can be sure that you will go to prison. So you will be well advised to stay off the drink and co-operate fully with the Courts. Very well, no action will be taken on the breach of probation.
