Her Majesty's Attorney General -v- J.J. Rowley

**Infraction of the Social Security Law.**

**DEPUTY BAILIFF:** This is a serious matter because of the number of previous convictions for the same offence. Nevertheless, we are going to take into account that this is not nearly as serious as the previous occasion when you were before this Court because on that occasion employees were involved, and we are also going to take into account that you have said that you were very sorry and have apologised to the Court. In those circumstances the Court is going to apply the following sentence. In respect with the first count, that is the failure to make a payment slip, you will be fined as asked for by the Solicitor General, the sum of fifty pounds or in default of payment one week's imprisonment. On the second count, the failure to pay contributions, you will be fined two hundred and fifty pounds, or, in default five weeks' imprisonment making a total of three hundred pounds or six weeks, and in respect of costs you will pay costs of one hundred pounds. Do you need time to pay, how long. Yes, very well - one month to pay.
