**JUDGMENT**

DEPUTY BAILIFF: The Court agrees with what is proposed, so, Wright, you are given bail on your own recognizance, in other words without furnishing money, for a period of five weeks from today to enable you to travel from Jersey next Tuesday, the 5th July, for a period of assessment at Filey Lodge Probation Hostel. As you have heard, that will be subject to three conditions. Firstly, you will reside at Filey Lodge Probation Hostel during the period of assessment. Secondly, you will obey the rules and you will co-operate with the programme given to you. Thirdly, you will come back to Jersey and will give yourself up into custody in order to appear here five weeks from today. Let me make it absolutely clear to you that if you were

to abscond from Filey Lodge, you would be an offender at large and there would be a warrant issued for your arrest. And of course, pending your transfer on Tuesday, you remain in custody.
