JUDGMENT

THE BAILIFF: We cannot find that this was other than a deliberate series of offences committed over a reasonably short space of time but with premeditation and a course of conduct which must merit imprisonment. Mr. Messervy we have taken into account everything you have said, but we really cannot think that binding over would reflect the seriousness of what your client did. We have taken into account his achievements, we have read the papers, and we have taken into account the fact that he was at least out of trouble in this jurisdiction in the United Kingdom between 1971 and 1984 and for that

reason and in the hope that he will pull himself together when he comes out, we are going to reduce the conclusions slightly and sentence him to nine months. Accordingly, you will be sentenced to nine months' imprisonment on each of the counts as asked for by the Attorney General.
