**JUDGMENT**

BAILIFF: The Jurats were divided on this matter, one was for allowing bail, the other was against it. I therefore decided that it would be right to grant bail. You will be placed on £5,000 bail. Secondly your passport is to be sent over here and surrendered to the police. Thirdly, you will remain in custody until the money and passport is produced. Fourthly, if you are released when the passport and money has been given to the Jersey police/Viscount, you will report daily to the Jersey police until you leave Jersey. Fifthly, if you get to England you will report twice a week to the East Dulwich Police Station and if you come back to Jersey before your trial, you will continue to

report daily here. If you don't do any of these things, you will be arrested and brought back in custody. You will notify the police of your address and any changes both in the United Kingdom and here.
