JUDGMENT

BAILIFF: We are satisfied that both cases are ones where it would be appropriate to allow bail. They are both first offenders to all intents and purposes, both are pleading not guilty, both have co-operated with the police, both have some ties in England which obviously will affect their position. Nevertheless, the bail should be reasonably substantial and tied to a number of conditions. You will each be placed on bail of £2,000; you will surrender your passports if you have one (that applies only to Bull, I suppose); thirdly you will report to the police once a week, either in the United Kingdom at the

appropriate Police Station which will be worked out with the Jersey Police, or in Jersey if you happen to be in Jersey, whichever the case may be. Until the bail is provided you will both remain in custody.
