JUDGMENT

DEPUTY BAILIFF: There are no grounds for interfering with the Magistrate's decision. In the two cases submitted to us and in the earlier case this morning, there was the very significant difference of a not guilty plea. Here the offence is admitted. Here we have no reason to think that the Magistrate failed to apply the correct principles. The only real ground advanced is the desire to be free for the festive season and is not a ground that we can take into account on a review of the Magistrate's decision. Therefore the application is refused.
