**The Cycle Routes (Amendment No. 2) Order (Northern Ireland)
2011**

Made - - - - - *17th May 2011*

Coming into operation - *11th June 2011*

The Department for Regional Development^(a) makes the following Order in exercise of the powers conferred by Article 4(1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation (Northern Ireland) Order 1997^(b) and now vested in it^(c).

The Department has consulted such persons as it considered appropriate in compliance with paragraphs 1 and 2 of Schedule 1 to that Order.

The Department has published a notice in compliance with paragraphs 1 and 3 of that Schedule.

No written objection or other representation has been received.

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as The Cycle Routes (Amendment No. 2) Order (Northern Ireland) 2011 and shall come into operation on 11th June 2011.

Amendments

2. The Cycle Routes Order (Northern Ireland) 2008^(d) shall be amended by the addition to Schedule 2 of the following items—

“370. The footpath through Festival Park, extending in a north-westerly direction for a distance of 67 metres from its junction with the C663 Townview Avenue, to its junction with the U3000 Festival Park.

371. The footpath through Festival Park, extending in a north-westerly direction for a distance of 88 metres from its junction with the U3000 Festival Park, to a point 12 metres south-east of the A5 Great Northern Road underpass.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order)

This Order further amends The Cycle Routes Order (Northern Ireland) 2008 (“the Order”). The effect of the amendments is to introduce two-way cycle tracks on the lengths of footpath specified in Article 2.

Any person who acts in contravention of any provision of the Order relating to cycle tracks shall be guilty of an offence under the Road Traffic Regulation (Northern Ireland) Order 1997 (“the Regulation Order”) and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level 3 on the standard scale (£1,000), in accordance with the Road Traffic Offenders (Northern Ireland) Order 1996 as amended by the Regulation Order.

Traffic signs indicating the effect of the Order will in due course be placed on the road.
