**The A96 Trunk Road (Church Road, Keith) (Special Event)
(Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2010**

Coming into force

2nd November 2010
14th November 2010

The Scottish Ministers make the following Order in exercise of the powers conferred by section 16A, 2(1) and (2) and 4(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a) and all other powers enabling them to do so.

In accordance with section 16A(2) of that Act, they are satisfied that traffic on the length of road specified in the Schedule to this Order should be prohibited for the purpose of facilitating the holding of a relevant event, being the Keith Armistice Day Parade, 2010, and enabling members of the public to watch that event.

In accordance with section 16A(3) of that Act, they are satisfied that it is not reasonably practicable for that event to be held otherwise than on that length of road.

In accordance with section 16A(8) of that Act, they have had regard to the safety and convenience of alternative routes suitable for traffic which will be affected by this Order.

Citation, commencement and cessation

1. This Order may be cited as the A96 Trunk Road (Church Road, Keith) (Special Event) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2010, comes into force on 14th November 2010 and ceases to have effect at midnight on 14th November 2010.

The functions of the Secretary of State were transferred to the Scottish Ministers by section 53 of the Scotland Act 1998 (c.46).

Prohibition of use of vehicles

2. Subject to article 3 no person shall use or permit the use of, any vehicle on the length of road specified in the Schedule when such prohibition is identified as applying to any part or parts of that length of road by means of traffic signs prescribed in Diagrams 7010.1 and 7105 of the Traffic Signs Regulations 2002(a).

Exemption for emergency and works vehicles

3. This Order does not apply to a vehicle while being used in an emergency for fire brigade, coastguard, ambulance, or police purposes, or a vehicle while being used in connection with the placing of the required signage.

SCHEDULE

That length of the A96 Aberdeen – Inverness Trunk Road known as Church Road, Keith from its junction with Banff Road, Keith to its junction with Seafield Avenue, Keith, a distance of 200 metres or thereby.
