# JUDGMENT

The **Judgment** of the Employment Tribunal is as follows:

The Claimant's complaints of unauthorised deductions from wages and damages for breach of contract are well-founded and she is awarded the following sums payable by the Respondent (all figures are shown gross):

Accrued but untaken statutory holiday pay:	£1784.61 <sup>1</sup>
Statutory pay in lieu of notice of one week:	£923.07
Unpaid expenses:	£102.24

The total award is £2,809.92.

<sup>1</sup> Explanatory note:

The Claimant received final wages and accrued but undertaken holiday pay of £8,820.51. The Respondent admits that the final payment was of wages and accrued annual leave but has not provided a payslip breaking these figures down. However, her usual monthly salary was £6,666.66. She was entitled to 24.8 days annual leave accrued during the period of her employment. She had taken 12 days paid leave. The balance owing was 12.8 days which totalled £3,938.46. Deducting the figure of usual monthly salary and holiday owing from the amount received leaves the further sum of £1784.61 owing in respect of holiday pay.
