Judgment of the Lords of the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council on the Appeal of Sachindra Nath Roy and others v. The Secretary of State for India in Council, from the High Court of Judicature at Fort William in Bengal, delivered the 29th October 1912.

This case has been very fully and very ably argued by Mr. De Gruyther. Speaking without having heard the other side, it is impossible to say that much of his criticism was not well founded. But this Board is not sitting as a Court of first instance. The Board is not satisfied that the two judgments, which are in effect concurrent, are erroneous. It is purely a question of fact. Both Courts have come to a certain conclusion, and their Lordships do not think that they can interfere.

Their Lordships will therefore humbly advise His Majesty that the Appeal ought to be dismissed, and the Appellants will pay the costs.
