Their Lordships have considered the evidence which has been so clearly reviewed by Mr. De Gruyther in opening this appeal, and they have come to the conclusion that it is not sufficient to lead them to hold that the leasehold tenure of the persons claiming under the lease of 99 years was ever changed into a permanent tenure. That is not satisfactorily established, and their Lordships are therefore of opinion that there is nothing to lead them to the conclusion that the decree appealed from is erroneous. They will, therefore, humbly advise His Majesty that this appeal should be dismissed with costs.
