I never owned any bicycle but as far as I remember on Friday in the morning I went over to the garage and I saw one of the bicycles at the window. I did not know the owner of the cycle as I did not take pleasure to find a name to it. I don't remember where I intended to go. I saw at the bicycle as a free wheel or fixed wheel bicycle. I don't remember what I was doing when I remembered that as I was riding on the main road at Hampden New I saw in the path of a truck that was travelling towards me from the opposite direction. I don't remember if I were riding on a road or a ^{down} hill or on the level but about three weeks after that Friday I found myself in the hospital. I don't know the name of the hospital. I heard other patients saying that I was brought here to the hospital but I don't know as I was in an accident connected with a truck. I told the patients that I knew nothing about such an accident. I was called here a cut in my forehead and a hand broken. The left hand was broken three places. I received nineteen stitches in my head and both hands were placed in casts. I don't know name as U.C. Hospital but my mother came here & gave my name to the nurses.

I was taken from the hospital by my mother but I don't know the date. I went home with my mother



CLIVE MALCOLM STATES:

I am 17 years old. Born on the 2nd May, 1956 at Hectors River, Portland. Mother, Violet Moore now living at Long Road district, Newton Pen P.O.

Father, Emanuel Malcolm, now living at Long Road.

I attended Villa school and Seaside school in Hectors River and left in form 2. I can read and write. I learned to do woodwork at Villa school and can make human heads out of wood.

I left Long Road for Ocho Rios in 1969 and was at Cox's Woodworks at Great Pond until 1972, making guitars and R'humba boxes for sale to tourists. I then got \$7.00 per week. I was then living alone in a room at Mr. Robb's house at Harrison Town free. Mr. Aubrey Robb came from America and as I was then living at his premises I came to Spanish Town with him as he started a garage at Jones Pen, Spanish Town known as Spanish Town Motors.

I worked with Mr. Robb as a labourer in the garage also did small errands for him. He paid me \$22.00 per week and I slept in the garage. I left the work and for a few days I went to work at a house being built in Greendale by a man named Toney by digging a latrine pit and carrying cement. I don't remember how many days I worked with Toney nor if I got any pay but I still slept in the garage. I don't know if Mr. Robb knew I was sleeping there. I never owned any bicycle but as far as I remember on a Friday in the month of June I went over to the garage and rode away one of the bicycles at the garage. I did not know the owner of the cycle

as I did not ask anyone to lend same to me. I don't remember where I intended to go, I don't remember if the bicycle was free-wheel or fixed-wheel bicycle. I don't remember if it had on any brakes. I remember that as I was riding on the main road at Thompson Pen, I ran into the front of a truck that was travelling towards me from the opposite direction. I don't remember if I were riding around a curve, down or up a hill or on the level, but about three weeks after that Friday I found myself in U.C. Hospital I did not know the Ward in which I was. I heard other patients saying that I was brought from Spanish Town Hospital by ambulance as I was in an accident with a truck. I told the patients that I know nothing about about such an accident. I was suffering from a cut in my forehead, both hands broken. The left arm broken three places. I received nineteen stitches in my head and both hands were placed in casts. I did not give my name at U.C. Hospital but my mother came there and gave my name to the nurses. I was taken from the hospital by my mother but I don't know the date. I went home with my mother.

The head pains me much, the right hand is now feeling good but the left hand is longer than the right and swollen.

I don't know what happened to the cycle. I don't know whose truck was in collision with me neither the hour of the day it occurred.

I have not given a statement to the police. I remember that I was travelling alone at the time of accident. I have no witness to the accident. I gave this statement
