**1968 CHAPTER 28**

An Act to restrict the operation of section 15 of the Wills Act 1837. [30th May 1968]

**B**E IT ENACTED by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1.—(1) For the purposes of section 15 of the Wills Act 1837 (avoidance of gifts to attesting witnesses and their spouses) the attestation of a will by a person to whom or to whose spouse there is given or made any such disposition as is described in that section shall be disregarded if the will is duly executed without his attestation and without that of any other such person. Restriction of operation of Wills Act 1837, s. 15. 1837 c. 26.

(2) This section applies to the will of any person dying after the passing of this Act, whether executed before or after the passing of this Act.

2.—(1) This Act may be cited as the Wills Act 1968.

Short title and extent.

(2) This Act does not extend to Scotland or Northern Ireland.
