Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Supreme Court Fees (Amendment) Order 2011 and comes into force on 5th August 2011.

Amendment of the Supreme Court Fees Order 2009

2. Schedule 1 (Fees payable in the Supreme Court) of the Supreme Court Fees Order 2009(b) is amended as follows.

3. In column 2 of fee 1.1 (on filing an application for permission to appeal), for “£800” substitute “£1,000”.
