**CIVIL AVIATION**

**The Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Abingdon Airshow)  
Regulations 2011**

*Made* - - - - *3rd February 2011*

*Coming into force* - - *6th May 2011*

The Secretary of State deems it necessary in the public interest to restrict flying in the vicinity of Abingdon, Oxfordshire by reason of the holding of a flying display that is scheduled to take place during the period from 6th to 8th May 2011.

The Secretary of State makes the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by article 161 of the Air Navigation Order 2009(a).

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Abingdon Airshow) Regulations 2011 and come into force on 6th May 2011.

2. In regulation 3 all times referred to are Co-ordinated Universal Time.

3.—(1) Subject to paragraph (2)—

- (a) between 1300 hours and 1630 hours on 6th May 2011,
- (b) between 1100 hours and 1400 hours on 7th May 2011, and
- (c) between 1100 hours and 1715 hours on 8th May 2011,

no aircraft is to fly below 7,000 feet above mean sea level within the area of a circle having a radius of 5 nautical miles whose centre is at 514128N 0011900W.

(2) Paragraph (1) does not apply to any aircraft flying—

- (a) in accordance with a clearance issued by the air traffic control unit at Royal Air Force Brize Norton, or
- (b) with the prior permission of the flying display director at Abingdon aerodrome.

## **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

*(This note is not part of the Regulations)*

The Abingdon Air & Country Show will take place at Abingdon aerodrome, Oxfordshire between 6th and 8th May 2011. This event will be open to the general public, and a large number of aircraft will be involved in high-energy manoeuvres during the airshow. The Civil Aviation Authority considers that flying should be restricted in the vicinity of Abingdon aerodrome for reasons of public safety.

Full details of the Statutory Instrument will be promulgated by Aeronautical Information Circular and NOTAM.
