ROAD TRAFFIC

**The M1 Motorway (South of Junction 29) (Temporary
Restriction and Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2011**

Made - - - - *4th February 2011*
Coming into force - - *11th February 2011*

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M1 Motorway (“the M1”), is satisfied that traffic on a length of that motorway in the County of Derbyshire should be restricted and prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14 (1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the M1 Motorway (South of Junction 29) (Temporary Restriction and Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2011 and shall come into force on 11th February 2011.

2. In this Order:

| ”the motorway” | means the southbound carriageways of the M1 between a point 2000 metres and a point 2600 metres south of the centreline of the A617 southern overbridge at Junction 29; |
| “the Regulations” | means the Motorways Traffic (England and Wales) Regulations 1982(b); |
| “a hard shoulder” | means the hard shoulder within the meaning of regulation 3(1) (e) of the Regulations which is adjacent to the motorway; |
| “the works period” | means the period starting at 2300 hours on Monday 14 February 2011 and ending when the said works have been completed; |

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in articles 5 and 6, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to be driven at a speed exceeding 50 miles per hour on the motorway.

4. Subject as mentioned in articles 5 and 6, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed on the motorway.

5. The provisions of articles 3 and 4 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.

6. The provisions of:

(a) articles 3 and 4 shall not apply to any vehicle being used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes; and

(b) article 4 shall not apply to any vehicle –

(i) being used in connection with the said works;

(ii) being used by a traffic officer in uniform; or

(iii) proceeding at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police constable, or traffic officer in uniform.

7. During the works period, regulations 5 and (in so far as it relates to a vehicle being driven) 9 of the Regulations are hereby suspended in respect of a hard shoulder, at such times and to such extent as may from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.
