ROAD TRAFFIC

**The M54 Motorway (Junction 6) (Temporary Restriction
and Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2012**

Made - - - - *3rd April 2012*

Coming into force - - *10th April 2012*

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M54 Motorway (“the M54”) and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic on a length of that motorway and two of those connecting roads in the District of Telford and Wrekin should be restricted and prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), and of all other powers enabling her in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order: -

1. This Order may be cited as the M54 Motorway (Junction 6) (Temporary Restriction and Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2012 and shall come into force on 10th April 2012.

2. In this Order:

“a slip road” means –
(i) the slip road leading from the westbound carriageway of the M54 at Junction 6; and
(ii) the slip road leading from the eastbound carriageway of the M54 at Junction 6;

“the works period” means the period starting on Monday 16th April 2012 and ending when the said works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in articles 5 and 6, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to be driven at a speed exceeding 40 miles per hour on a slip road.

4. Subject as mentioned in articles 5 and 6 no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed on a slip road.

5. The provisions of articles 3 and 4 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.

6. The provisions of –

(a) articles 3 and 4 shall not apply to any vehicle –

(i) being used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes; or

(ii) proceeding at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police constable;

(b) article 3 shall not apply to any vehicle being used for Special Forces purposes; and

(c) article 4 shall not apply to any vehicle being used in connection with the said works or by, or with the permission of, a traffic officer in uniform.
