**ROAD TRAFFIC**

**The A19 Trunk Road (Crathorne Interchange to Parkway Interchange) (Temporary Restriction and Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2012**

*Made* - - - - - *20th September 2012*

*Coming into force* - - - - - *27th September 2012*

WHEREAS, the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A19 Trunk Road and connecting roads, in the Districts of Stockton and Middlesbrough, is satisfied that traffic on that trunk road and some of those connecting roads should be restricted and prohibited because bridge repair works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), makes the following Order: -

1. This Order may be cited as the A19 Trunk Road (Crathorne Interchange to Parkway Interchange) (Temporary Restriction and Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2012 and shall come into force on 27th September 2012.

2. In this Order; -

“the A19” means the A19 Trunk Road;

“the first length of carriageway” means the A19 northbound carriageway from a point 1650 metres south of the centreline of Low Lane overbridge northwards for a distance of 1750 metres;

“the second length of carriageway” means the A19 northbound carriageway from the nose of the northbound exit slip road at the A67 Crathorne Interchange to the nose of the northbound entry slip road at the A174 Parkway Interchange, a distance of approximately 7820 metres;

“a slip road” means the A19 northbound entry slip road at Crathorne Interchange and the A19 northbound exit slip road at Parkway Interchange;

“a layby” means an area of carriageway intended for the waiting of vehicles, bounded partly by a road marking on the outer edge of that carriageway complying with diagram 1010 in Schedule 6 to the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002(b); and in this definition “carriageway” means any way (other than a cycle track) comprised in the A19 over which the public have a right of way for the passage of vehicles and which has a surface suitable for the exercise of that right;

“the first works period” means the period starting at 00:01 hours on Friday 28th September 2012 and ending when the said works have been completed;

“the second works period” means a period of 10 hours starting at 20:00 hours on Friday 28th September 2012 or any subsequent night thereafter until the said works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 6 no person shall, during the first works period, cause or permit any vehicle to be driven at a speed exceeding 50 miles per hour in the first length of carriageway.

4. Subject as mentioned in article 6 no person shall, during the second works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the second length of carriageway or a second slip road.

5. Subject as mentioned in article 6 no person shall, during the second works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or wait in a layby situated adjacent to the A19 northbound carriageway between Parkway Interchange and Crathorne Interchange, a distance of approximately 7820 metres.

6. The provisions of articles 3, 4 and 5 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs. Nothing in articles 4 and 5 shall apply to:

- (a) a vehicle being used for police, fire and rescue authority or ambulance purposes;
- (b) a vehicle being used for, or in connection with, the said works, or for traffic officer or winter maintenance purposes; or
- (c) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a constable or traffic officer in uniform;

and nothing in article 3 shall apply to any vehicle being used for a purpose specified in paragraph (a) of this article.

7. No speed limit imposed by this Order applies to vehicles falling within regulation 3(4) of the Road Traffic Exemptions (Special Forces) (Variation and Amendment) Regulations 2011(a) when used in accordance with regulation 3(5) of those Regulations.
