ROAD TRAFFIC

The A419 Trunk Road (Commonhead to Cricklade) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2012

Made - - - - *18th October 2012*

Coming into force - - *26th October 2012*

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A419 Trunk Road (“the A419”) and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic on lengths of that road and some of those connecting roads in the Borough of Swindon and in Wiltshire should be prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1) (a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:

1. This Order may be cited as the A419 Trunk Road (Commonhead to Cricklade) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2012 and shall come into force on 26th October 2012.

2. In this Order -

“the first length of the A419” means the northbound carriageway of the A419 at Swindon from the tip of the nosing of the northbound exit slip road at the Commonhead Junction to the tip of the nosing of the northbound entry slip road at the Turnpike Junction;

“the second length of the A419” means the northbound carriageway of the A419 from the tip of the nosing of the northbound exit slip road at the Turnpike Junction, Swindon, to the tip of the nosing of the northbound entry slip road at the Cricklade Junction;

“the first slip roads” mean (i) the A419 northbound entry slip road at the Commonhead Junction; (ii) the A419 northbound exit and entry slip roads at the A420 White Hart Junction; and (iii) the A419 northbound exit and entry slip roads at the A361 Rat Trap Junction;

“the second slip roads” means (i) the A419 northbound entry slip road at the Turnpike Junction; and (ii) the A419 northbound exit slip road at the Cricklade Junction;

“tip of the nosing” means the first point where an entry slip road joins the carriageway of a trunk road or the last point where an exit slip road leaves the carriageway of a trunk road;

“the works” mean maintenance works including surfacing, white lining, studding, grass cutting and gully emptying;

“a works period” means a period of 10 hours starting at 20.00 hours on Monday 29th October 2012 or on any subsequent day and ending when the said works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 4, no person shall, during a works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the first length of the A419, the first slip roads, the second length of the A419 and the second slip roads.

4. The provisions of article 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs, and shall not apply to:

- (a) a vehicle being used for police, traffic officer, fire and rescue authority or ambulance purposes;
- (b) a vehicle being used at the direction, or with the permission, of a constable or traffic officer in uniform.
- (c) a vehicle being used in connection with the said works;
- (d) a vehicle proceeding to or from premises that are accessible from and only from the trunk road.
