The Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Trooping the Colour) (Amendment) Regulations 2013

Made - - - 10th June 2013

Coming into force - - 15th June 2013

The Secretary of State deems it necessary in the public interest to restrict flying in the vicinity of Charing Cross, London by reason of the Trooping of the Colour ceremony that is scheduled to take place on 15th June 2013.

The Secretary of State makes the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by article 161 of the Air Navigation Order 2009^(a).

Citation and commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Trooping the Colour) (Amendment) Regulations 2013 and come into force on 15th June 2013.

Amendment of Regulations

2.—(1) The Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Trooping the Colour) Regulations 2013^(b) are amended as follows.

(2) In regulation 3(2)(e), for the words “Jonathan Schulten” substitute “Aiden Gibson”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations amend the Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Trooping the Colour) Regulations 2013 (S.I. 2013/424) (“the principal Regulations”). The amendment is necessitated by a change in the identity of the police officer from the Metropolitan Police Service who is able to grant authority to a pilot to depart from the flying restrictions set out in regulation 3(1) of the principal Regulations. Thus, Chief Inspector Jonathan Schulten is replaced by Chief Inspector Aiden Gibson in regulation 3(2)(e) of those Regulations.
