**The A38 Trunk Road (Marley Head to Wrangaton, Devon)
(Temporary Restriction and Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2013**

Made - - - - *3rd September 2013*

Coming into force - - *7th September 2013*

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A38 Trunk Road (“the A38”) and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic on lengths of that road and some of those connecting roads near South Brent and Ivybridge in the County of Devon should be restricted and prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the A38 Trunk Road (Marley Head to Wrangaton, Devon) (Temporary Restriction and Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2013 and shall come into force on 7th September 2013.

2. In this Order –

“the first length of the A38” means the westbound carriageway of the A38 from the tip of the nosing of the westbound entry slip road at the Marley Head Junction (near South Brent) to a point 200 metres west of the tip of the nosing of the westbound exit slip road at the Wrangaton Junction (near Ivybridge);

“the second length of the A38” means the westbound carriageway of the A38 from a point 1800 metres west of the tip of the nosing of the westbound entry slip road at the Marley Head Junction (near South Brent) to a point 200 metres west of the tip of the nosing of the westbound exit slip road at the Wrangaton Junction (near Ivybridge);

“the third length of the A38” means the westbound carriageway of the A38 from the tip of the nosing of the westbound exit slip road at the Marley Head Junction to the tip of the nosing of the westbound entry slip road at the South Brent Junction;

“the slip roads” mean (i) the westbound entry slip road at the A38 Marley Head Junction; (ii) the eastbound exit slip road at the A38 South Brent Junction; and (iii) the westbound exit slip road at the A38 Wrangaton Junction;

“layby” means an area of carriageway intended for the waiting of vehicles, bounded partly by a road marking on the outer edge of that carriageway complying with diagram 1010 in Schedule 6 to the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002(b); and in this definition “carriageway” means any way (other than a cycle track) comprised in the trunk road

over which the public have a right of way for the passage of vehicles and which has a surface suitable for the exercise of that right;

“tip of the nosing” means the first point where an entry slip road joins the carriageway of a trunk road or the last point where an exit slip road leaves the carriageway of a trunk road;

“the works” mean resurfacing works and associated road markings, studs and nodes;

“a works period” means a period of 11 hours starting at 19.00 hours on Monday 9th September 2013 or on any subsequent day and ending when the said works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in articles 7 and 9, no person shall, during a works period, drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 50 miles per hour on the first length of the A38.

4. Subject as mentioned in articles 7 and 9, no person shall, during a works period, drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 10 miles per hour on the second length of the A38 whilst traffic signs of a character authorised under section 64 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 indicating “convoy working” on that road are displayed.

5. Subject as mentioned in articles 7 and 8, no person shall, during a works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the third length of the A38 and the slip roads.

6. Subject as mentioned in articles 7 and 8, no person shall, during a works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter, proceed or remain in the laybys adjacent to the westbound carriageway of the A38 situated:

- (a) 785 metres west of the tip of the nosing of the westbound entry slip road at the A38 Marley Head Junction;
- (b) 2385 metres west of the tip of the nosing of the westbound entry slip road at the A38 Marley Head Junction.

7. The provisions of articles 3, 4, 5 and 6 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to:

- (a) a vehicle being used for police, fire and rescue authority or ambulance purposes;
- (b) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a constable.

8. The provisions of articles 5 and 6 shall not apply to a vehicle being used for or in connection with the said works or for traffic officer purposes.

9. No speed limit imposed by this order applies to vehicles falling within regulation 3(4) of the Road Traffic Exemptions (Special Forces) (Variation and Amendment) Regulations 2011 when used in accordance with regulation 3(5) of those Regulations.
