

“the works period” means a period starting at 0001 hours on Sunday 4 August 2013 and ending at 2359 hours on Monday 31 March 2014. Works may start and continue beyond these dates for such period not exceeding 18 months as shall be required to complete the works.

“works” means roundabout construction at the junction of the first and second Trunk Roads;

“layby” means an area of carriageway intended for the waiting of vehicles and bounded partly by a traffic sign of the type shown in diagram 101 in schedule 6 to the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002 (a) and partly by the outer edge of that carriageway on the same side of the road as that on which the sign is placed; and in this definition “carriageway” means any way (other than a cycle way) comprised in the trunk road over which the public have right of way for the passage of vehicles and which has a surface suitable for the exercise of that right;

“the first layby to be closed” means the layby adjacent to the westbound carriageway of the first Trunk Road situated with centre 243 metres east of the centreline of the junction with Roam Wood Lane;

“the second layby to be closed” means the layby adjacent to the eastbound carriageway of the A590 trunk road Arrad Foot situated at a point 548 metres west of the centreline of the junction with Arrad Foot local access road;

"overall width" has the meaning given in regulation 3 (2) of the Road Vehicles (Construction and Use) Regulations 1986 (b)

3. Subject as mentioned in articles 9 and 10 of this Order, during the works period, no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to be driven in the first or second length of carriageway at a speed exceeding 10 miles per hour whilst traffic signs of a character authorised under Section 64 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 indicating “convoy working” on these lengths of road are displayed.
4. Subject as mentioned in article 9 of this Order, during the works period, no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to overtake a moving vehicle or make a ‘U’ turn in the first, second or third length of carriageway.
5. Subject as mentioned in article 9 of this Order, during the works period, no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the first, second or fourth lengths of carriageway.
6. i) During such times as pursuant to article 9 of this Order, movement of traffic is prohibited in one or more lanes of the first length of carriageway, but is not prohibited in any lane of the second length of carriageway, no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in one or more lanes of the second length of carriageway in any direction other than eastbound.

ii) When, pursuant to article 9 of this Order, movement is prohibited in one or more lanes of a carriageway but is not prohibited in any lane of the corresponding length of the other carriageway, the provisions of this article with respect to that other carriageway shall apply to that length of carriageway.
7. Subject as mentioned in article 9 of this Order no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any motor vehicle with an overall width exceeding 3.2 metres (10 feet 6 inches) to enter or proceed in a lane of the first or second length of carriageway, as indicated by traffic signs.
8. Subject as mentioned in article 9 of this Order, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the first or second lay-by to be closed.
9. The provisions of articles 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 and 8 of this Order shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs, and shall not apply to

a vehicle being used for emergency purposes by the police, fire and rescue authority or ambulance services or anything done at the direction, or with the permission, of a constable, or a traffic officer in uniform.

And nothing in article 4 or 8 of this Order shall apply to any vehicle being used in connection with the said works or by traffic officers.

- 10.** No speed limit imposed by this Order applies to vehicles falling within regulations 3(4) of the Road Traffic Exemptions (Special Forces) (Variation and Amendment) Regulations 2011(a) when used in accordance with Regulation 3(5) of those Regulations.
