**The Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Carnoustie)
Regulations 2021**

Made - - - - *13th July 2021*

Coming into force - - *15th August 2021*

The Secretary of State has decided that it is in the public interest to restrict flying in the vicinity of Carnoustie, Angus, Scotland by reason of the security operation associated with the intended holding of the Women's Open Golf Championships 2021.

The Secretary of State makes the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by article 239 of the Air Navigation Order 2016^(a).

Citation and commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Carnoustie) Regulations 2021 and come into force on 15th August 2021.

Interpretation

2. In regulation 3(1) the times referred to are Co-ordinated Universal Time^(b).

Restricted airspace

3.—(1) Subject to paragraph (2), between 0400 hours and 2200 hours on each day beginning on 15th August 2021 and ending on 23rd August 2021 no aircraft is to fly below 2,500 feet above mean sea level within the area bounded successively by straight lines joining—

- (a) 563214N 0023927W,
- (b) 562940N 0024910W,
- (c) 562630N 0024615W,
- (d) 562910N 0023655W, and
- (e) 563214N 0023927W.

(2) Paragraph (1) does not apply to any aircraft—

- (a) operating by or on behalf of —
 - (i) Police Scotland,
 - (ii) the Scottish Air Ambulance Service, or

^(a) S.I. 2016/765, to which there are amendments not relevant to these Regulations.

^(b) In these Regulations, Co-ordinated Universal Time (UTC) is one hour behind British Summer Time (BST).

- (iii) the Maritime and Coastguard Agency for the purposes of search and rescue only, or
- (b) operating in accordance with a permission issued by the Police Scotland Aviation Safety and Security Unit.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations impose restrictions on flying in the vicinity of Carnoustie, Angus, Scotland as part of the security arrangements for the Women's Open Golf Championships 2021. Police Scotland considers that flying should be restricted in the vicinity of the Championships for security reasons, and this has been agreed with by the Civil Aviation Authority and Department for Transport.

The times mentioned in regulation 3(1) are Co-ordinated Universal Time (UTC) which is one hour behind British Summer Time (BST).
