Sir,

On instructions from Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, I have the honour to inform you that the Government of Bahrain have expressed a desire that arrangements might be made whereby they could participate in assistance from the United Nations International Children's Emergency Fund and in this connection, I have the honour to propose that, in accordance with the desire of that Government, the Agreement between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the United Nations International Children's Emergency Fund, which was signed at London on the 7th of October, 1953,⁽¹⁾ and the Protocol to that Agreement, which was signed at New York on the 7th of July, 1959,⁽²⁾ shall, pending further consideration of possible revision of those instruments be regarded as extended to Bahrain, for the conduct of whose international relations the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland are responsible.

If the foregoing proposal is acceptable to the United Nations, I have the honour to propose that this Note and your reply in that sense shall be regarded as constituting an Agreement between the Government of the United Kingdom, acting on behalf of the Government of Bahrain, and the United Nations.

Accept, Sir, the assurances of my highest consideration.
