BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED KINGDOM
OF GREAT BRITAIN AND NORTHERN IRELAND AND THE
GOVERNMENT OF KENYA AMENDING AND EXTENDING THE
BRITISH EXPATRIATES SUPPLEMENTATION (KENYA)
AGREEMENT 1971**

Sir

1. I have the honour to refer to discussions that have taken place between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of Kenya concerning the continuance of the British Expatriates Supplementation (Kenya) Agreement 1971⁽¹⁾ (hereinafter referred to as "the Agreement") and certain matters related to passage costs thereunder and to propose that the Agreement be amended as follows:

1. In sub-paragraph 2 of paragraph 1 after the word "grants" add the punctuation and words ", medical expenses".
2. In sub-paragraph 3 of paragraph 1 delete the words and figures "31 March 1976" and substitute therefor the words and figures "31 March 1981".
3. In paragraph 1 of Annex 1 after the word "payments" add the words "and reimbursements" and after the words "annex to" add the words "or in respect of".
4. Following paragraph 2 of Annex 1 add a new paragraph 3A to read:

"3A. The Government of the United Kingdom will reimburse the employing authority the amount paid by the employing authority in providing for designated officers and their dependent families passages on such occasions (not being occasions referred to in paragraph 3 of this Annex) as the Government of Kenya may with the prior concurrence of the Government of the United Kingdom, prescribe. Passages for designated officers and their dependent families should be, where available, by British carrier and where practicable by excursion or charter flight".

2. If this letter correctly sets out the terms that have been agreed, I have the honour to propose that this letter and your reply shall constitute an Agreement between the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern

Ireland and the Government of Kenya which shall enter into force on 31 March 1976 and which shall be cited together with the Agreement as the British Expatriates Supplementation (Kenya) (Continuance) Agreement 1971/76.
