# **ROAD TRAFFIC, WALES**

The A40 Trunk Road (Narberth Road and Fishguard Road, Haverfordwest, Pembrokeshire) (Temporary Traffic Restriction & Prohibition) Order 2011

Made

31 August 2011

Coming into force

12 September 2011

The Welsh Ministers, being the traffic authority for the relevant length of the London – Fishguard Trunk Road (A40) (hereinafter referred to as "the trunk road"), are satisfied that traffic in specified lengths of the trunk road should be restricted or prohibited by reason of works being executed thereon.

The Welsh Ministers, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section 14(1) and (4) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(1) and of all other enabling powers(2), make this Order.

1. This Order comes into force on 12 September 2011 and its title is The A40 Trunk Road (Narberth Road and Fishguard Road, Haverfordwest, Pembrokeshire) (Temporary Traffic Restriction & Prohibition) Order 2011.

#### **2.**—(1) In this Order:

"exempted vehicle" ("cerbyd esempt") means any vehicle being used for the emergency services or in connection with the works giving rise to this Order;

"the lengths of the trunk road" ("y darnau o'r gefnffordd") means those lengths of the A40 trunk road at Haverfordwest in the County of Pembrokeshire specified in the Schedule to this Order;

"works period" ("cyfnod y gwaith") means the period commencing at 08:00 hours on 12 September 2011 and ending when the temporary traffic signs are permanently removed.

- (2) Any reference in this Order to a numbered article or Schedule is a reference to the article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order.
- **3.** Subject to the provisions of article 5, no person shall, during the works period, drive or cause or permit any vehicle, other than an exempted vehicle, to proceed at a speed exceeding 10 miles per hour in the lengths of the trunk road specified in the Schedule to this Order.
- **4.** Subject to the provisions of article 5, no person shall, during the works period, use or permit the use of a vehicle, other than an exempted vehicle, in such a way that it overtakes any other vehicle in the lengths of the trunk road specified in the Schedule to this Order during such times as the restriction referred to in article 3 is in operation.
- **5.** The provisions of articles 3 and 4 apply only during such times and to such extent as the application of the restriction and prohibition referred to therein is indicated by traffic signs.
- **6.** The maximum duration of this Order shall be 6 months.

### **SCHEDULE**

The length of the trunk road known as Narberth Road that extends from a point 87 metres north east of the centre of its western junction with Cartlett Road to a point 1196 metres north east of the centre of the said junction.

The length of the trunk road known as Fishguard Road that extends from the centre of Scotchwell Roundabout to a point 125 metres north of the said roundabout.
