The A483 Trunk Road
(Ffairfach Level Crossing,
Ffairfach, Carmarthenshire)
(Temporary Prohibition of Vehicles)
Order 2015

Made 17 April 2015

Coming into force 23 April 2015

The Welsh Ministers, being the traffic authority for the relevant length of the Swansea – Manchester Trunk Road (A483) (“the trunk road”), are satisfied that traffic in a specified length of the trunk road should be prohibited because of works proposed on or near the road.

The Welsh Ministers, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section 14(1) and (4) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(1) and of all other enabling powers(2), make this Order.

Title, Interpretation and Commencement

1. This Order comes into force on the 23 April 2015 and its title is The A483 Trunk Road (Ffairfach Level Crossing, Ffairfach, Carmarthenshire) (Temporary Prohibition of Vehicles) Order 2015.

2. —(1) In this Order:

“the length of the trunk road” (“*y darn o’r gefnffordd*”) means the length of the trunk road known as Heol Cennen at Ffairfach in the County of Carmarthenshire that extends from a point 20 metres north of Ffairfach level crossing to a point 20 metres south of the said level crossing;

“works period” (“*cyfnod y gwaith*”) means that period commencing at 21:00 hours on 23 April 2015 and ending when the temporary traffic signs are permanently removed.

(2) Any reference in this Order to a numbered article is a reference to the article bearing that number in this Order.

Prohibition

3. Subject to the provisions of article 4, no person shall, during the works period, drive or cause or permit any vehicle to proceed in the length of the trunk road.

Application

4. The provisions of article 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as the application of the prohibition referred to therein is indicated by traffic signs.

Duration of this Order

5. The maximum duration of this Order shall be 18 months.
