**The A4810 Steelworks Access
Road (Queen’s Way, Llanwern,
Newport) (Temporary Prohibition
of Vehicles) Order 2015**

Made 5 May 2015

Coming into force 9 May 2015

The Welsh Ministers, being the traffic authority for the A4810 Steelworks Access Road (Queen’s Way) (“the access road”), are satisfied that traffic in a specified length of the access road should be prohibited because of works proposed on or near the road.

The Welsh Ministers, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section 14(1) and (4) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(1) and of all other enabling powers(2), make this Order.

Title, Interpretation and Commencement

1. This Order comes into force on 9 May 2015 and its title is The A4810 Steelworks Access Road (Queen’s Way, Llanwern, Newport) (Temporary Prohibition of Vehicles) Order 2015.

2.—(1) In this Order:

“exempted vehicle” (*“cerbyd esempt”*) means any vehicle being used by the emergency services or in connection with the works giving rise to this Order.

“the length of the access road” (*“y darn o’r ffordd fynediad”*) means the length of the access road at Llanwern in the City of Newport that extends from its junction with Celtic Business Park Roundabout to the TATA Steel Offices Roundabout;

“works period” (*“cyfnod y gwaith”*) means the period commencing at 07:00 hours on 9 May 2015 and ending when the temporary traffic signs are permanently removed.

(2) Any reference in this Order to a numbered article is a reference to the article bearing that number in this Order.

Prohibition

3. Subject to the provisions of article 4, no person shall, during the works period, drive or cause or permit any vehicle, other than an exempted vehicle, to proceed in the length of the access road.

Application

4. The provisions of article 3 apply only during such times and to such extent as the application of the prohibition referred to therein is indicated by traffic signs.

Duration of this Order

5. The maximum duration of this Order shall be 12 months.
