The A487 Trunk Road (Ysgol Tal y
Bont, Ceredigion) (Temporary Part-
time 20 mph Speed Limit) Order
2015

Made *8 June 2015*

Coming into force *11 June 2015*

The Welsh Ministers, being the traffic authority for the relevant length of the Fishguard – Bangor Trunk Road (A487) (“the trunk road”), are satisfied that traffic in a specified length of the trunk road should be restricted because of the likelihood of danger to the public.

The Welsh Ministers, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section 14(1) and (4) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984⁽¹⁾ and of all other enabling powers⁽²⁾, make this Order.

Title, Interpretation and Commencement

1. This Order comes into force on 11 June 2015. Its title is The A487 Trunk Road (Ysgol Tal y Bont, Ceredigion) (Temporary Part-time 20 mph Speed Limit) Order 2015.

2. —(1) In this Order:

“the length of the trunk road” (“*y darn o’r gefnffordd*”) means the length of the trunk road at Tal y Bont in the County of Ceredigion that extends from a point 465 metres north of its junction with Chapel Street to a point 246 metres south of the said junction.

(2) Any reference in this Order to a numbered article is a reference to the article bearing that number in this Order.

Restriction

3. Subject to the provisions of article 4, no person shall drive or cause or permit any vehicle to proceed at a speed exceeding 20 miles per hour in the length of the trunk road.

Application

4. The provisions of article 3 apply only during such times and to such extent as the application of the restriction referred to therein is indicated by activated traffic signs.

Duration of this Order

5. The maximum duration for this Order shall be 18 months.
