**ROAD TRAFFIC, WALES**

The A479 Trunk Road (Cwmdu to  
South of Talgarth, Powys)  
(Temporary Prohibition of Vehicles)  
Order 2016

*Made* 30 November 2016

*Coming into force* 5 December 2016

The Welsh Ministers, being the traffic authority for the Glanusk Park – Llyswen Trunk Road (A479) (“the trunk road”), are satisfied that traffic in a specified length of the trunk road should be prohibited because of works proposed on or near the road.

The Welsh Ministers, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section 14(1) and (4) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(1), make this Order.

**Title, Interpretation and Commencement**

1. This Order comes into force on 5 December 2016 and its title is The A479 Trunk Road (Cwmdu to South of Talgarth, Powys) (Temporary Prohibition of Vehicles) Order 2016.

2. —(1) In this Order:

“the length of the trunk road” (“*y darn o’r gefnffordd*”) means the length of the trunk road in the County of Powys that extends from the centre-point of its junction with the U0506/C0112 at Cwmdu to the centre-point of its junction with the C0087, south of Talgarth;

“works period” (“*cyfnod y gwaith*”) means that period commencing at 08:00 hours on 5 December 2016 and ending when the temporary traffic signs are permanently removed.

(2) Any reference in this Order to a numbered article is a reference to the article bearing that number in this Order.

### **Prohibition**

3. No person shall, during the works period, drive or cause or permit any vehicle to proceed in the length of the trunk road.

### **Application**

4. The prohibition in article 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as indicated by traffic signs.

### **Duration of this Order**

5. The maximum duration for this Order shall be 12 months.
