**The A477 Trunk Road (West of
Llanddowror to West of Red Roses,
Carmarthenshire) (Temporary
Prohibition of Vehicles) Order 2016**

Made 27 September 2016

Coming into force 3 October 2016

The Welsh Ministers, as traffic authority for the length of the St Clears – Pembroke Dock Trunk Road (A477) (“the trunk road”), are satisfied that traffic in a specified length of the trunk road should be prohibited because of works proposed on or near the road.

The Welsh Ministers, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section 14(1) and (4) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(1), make this Order.

Title, Interpretation and Commencement

1. This Order comes into force on 3 October 2016 and its title is The A477 Trunk Road (West of Llanddowror to West of Red Roses, Carmarthenshire) (Temporary Prohibition of Vehicles) Order 2016.

2. —(1) In this Order:

“exempted vehicle” (“*cerbyd esempt*”) means any vehicle being used by the emergency services or in connection with the works giving rise to this Order;

“the length of the trunk road” (“*y darn o’r gefnffordd*”) means that length of the trunk road between Llanddowror and Red Roses in the County of Carmarthenshire that extends from its junction with the C3227 Class III road, south-west of Llanddowror to its junction with the A477 bypass, west of Red Roses;

“works period” (“*cyfnod y gwaith*”) means that period commencing at 00:01 hours on 3 October 2016 and ending when the temporary traffic signs have been permanently removed.

(2) Any reference in this Order to a numbered article is a reference to the article bearing that number in this Order.

Prohibition

3. No person shall, during the works period, drive or cause or permit any vehicle, other than an exempted vehicle, to proceed in the length of the trunk road.

Application

4. The prohibition in article 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as indicated by traffic signs.

Duration of this Order

5. The maximum duration for this Order shall be 18 months.
