**The A55 Trunk Road (Slip Roads at
Junction 2 (Holyhead Interchange)
& Junction 5 (Treban Interchange),
Anglesey) (Temporary Prohibition
of Vehicles) Order 2019**

Made 2 October 2019

Coming into force 7 October 2019

The Welsh Ministers, as traffic authority for the relevant length of the A55 Trunk Road, are satisfied that traffic on specified lengths of the trunk road should be prohibited because of works proposed on or near the road.

The Welsh Ministers, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by sections 14(1) and (4) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(1), make this Order.

Title, Commencement and Interpretation

1. The title of this Order is the A55 Trunk Road (Slip Roads at Junction 2 (Holyhead Interchange) & Junction 5 (Treban Interchange), Anglesey) (Temporary Prohibition of Vehicles) Order 2019 and it comes into force on 7 October 2019.

2. In this Order:

“the trunk road” (“*y gefnffordd*”) means the A55 London to Holyhead Trunk Road;

“works period” (“*cyfnod y gwaith*”) means intermittent periods commencing at 18:00 hours on

7 October 2019 and ending when the temporary traffic signs for each period of works are removed.

Prohibition

3. No person may, during the works period, drive any vehicle on the lengths of the eastbound and westbound exit and entry slip roads of the trunk road at Junction 2 (Holyhead Interchange) and Junction 5 (Treban Interchange), Anglesey.

Application

4. The prohibition in article 3 applies only during such times and to such extent as indicated by traffic signs.

Duration of this Order

5. The maximum duration of this Order is 12 months.
