**ROAD TRAFFIC, WALES**

**The A55 Trunk Road (Eastbound  
Carriageway between Junction 23  
(Llanddulas) and Junction 24  
(Faenol Interchange), Conwy  
County Borough) (Temporary  
Prohibition of Vehicles, Cyclists  
and Pedestrians) Order 2019**

*Made* 14 January 2019

*Coming into force* 21 January 2019

The Welsh Ministers, as traffic authority for the A55 Trunk Road, are satisfied that traffic on a specified length of the trunk road should be prohibited because of works proposed on or near the road.

The Welsh Ministers, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section 14(1) and (4) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(1), make this Order.

**Title, Commencement and Interpretation**

**1.** The title of this Order is the A55 Trunk Road (Eastbound Carriageway between Junction 23 (Llanddulas) and Junction 24 (Faenol Interchange), Conwy County Borough) (Temporary Prohibition of Vehicles, Cyclists and Pedestrians) Order 2019 and it comes into force on 21 January 2019.

## 2. In this Order:

“exempted vehicle” (“*cerbyd esempt*”) means any vehicle being used by the emergency services or in connection with the works giving rise to this Order;

“the trunk road” (“*y gefnffordd*”) means the eastbound carriageway of the A55 Chester to Bangor trunk road between Junction 23 (Llanddulas) and Junction 24 (Faenol Interchange) in Conwy County Borough;

“works period” (“*cyfnod y gwaith*”) means the period commencing at 19:00 on 21 January 2019 and ending when the temporary traffic signs are permanently removed.

### **Prohibitions**

3. No person may, during the works period, drive or cause or permit any vehicle, other than an exempted vehicle, to proceed on the length of the trunk road.

4. No person may, during the works period, ride or cause to be ridden, any pedal cycle on the length of the trunk road.

5. No pedestrian may, during the works period, proceed on the length of the trunk road.

### **Application**

6. The prohibitions in article 3, 4 and 5 apply only during such times and to such extent as indicated by traffic signs.

### **Duration of this Order**

7. The maximum duration of this Order is 18 months.
