**ROAD TRAFFIC, WALES**

**The A48 Trunk Road (Mount  
Pleasant, Chepstow,  
Monmouthshire) (Temporary  
Prohibition of Pedestrians) Order  
2021**

*Made* 24 August 2021

*Coming into force* 31 August 2021

The Welsh Ministers, as traffic authority for the relevant length of the A48 trunk road, are satisfied that all pedestrians on a specified length of the trunk road should be prohibited because of works proposed on or near the road.

The Welsh Ministers, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section 14(1) and (4) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984<sup>(1)</sup>, make this Order.

**Title and commencement**

1. The title of this Order is the A48 Trunk Road (Mount Pleasant, Chepstow, Monmouthshire) (Temporary Prohibition of Pedestrians) Order 2021 and this Order comes into force on 31 August 2021.

**Interpretation**

2. In this Order—

“the trunk road” (“*y gefnffordd*”) means the A48 London to Fishguard trunk road;

“works period” (“*cyfnod y gwaith*”) means the period commencing at 20:00 hours on 31 August 2021 and ending when the temporary traffic signs are permanently removed.

**Prohibition**

3. No pedestrian may, during the works period, proceed on the length of the footway adjacent to the eastbound carriageway of the trunk road at Mount Pleasant, Chepstow, Monmouthshire that extends from a point 65 metres east of the junction with Hardwick Hill Lane to the junction with the B4293.

**Application**

4. The prohibition in article 3 applies only during such times and to such extent as indicated by traffic signs.

**Duration of this Order**

5. The maximum duration for this Order is 18 months.
