**The A470 Trunk Road (Llyswen,
Powys) (Temporary Prohibition of
Vehicles) Order 2024**

Made 18 September 2024

Coming into force 23 September 2024

The Welsh Ministers, as traffic authority for the A470 trunk road, are satisfied that traffic on a specified length of the trunk road should be prohibited because of works proposed on or near the road.

The Welsh Ministers, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section 14(1) and (4) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(1), make this Order.

Title and commencement

1. The title of this Order is the A470 Trunk Road (Llyswen, Powys) (Temporary Prohibition of Vehicles) Order 2024 and this Order comes into force on 23 September 2024.

Interpretation

2. In this Order—

“the trunk road” (“*y gefnffordd*”) means the A470 Cardiff to Llangurig trunk road;

“works period” (“*cyfnod y gwaith*”) means that period commencing at 08:00 hours on 23 September 2024 and ending when the temporary traffic signs are permanently removed.

By virtue of S.I. 1999/672, and section 162 of, and paragraph 30 of Schedule 11 to, the Government of Wales Act 2006 (c. 32), these functions are now exercisable by the Welsh Ministers in relation to Wales.

Prohibition

3. No person may, during the works period, drive any vehicle on the length of the A470 trunk road that extends from the centre-point of its junction with the A479 at Llyswen to a point 60 metres south-west of that said junction.

Application

4. The prohibition in article 3 applies only during such times and to such extent as indicated by traffic signs.

Duration of this Order

5. The maximum duration of this Order is 18 months.
